We are excited and welcome the PA Route 6 Maker's Market to this family oriented event. The PA Route 6 Maker's Market showcases local artisans and craftspeople. A special section of the festival will be dedicated to the makers along Route 6 who specialize in jewelry-making, pottery, baked goods, wineries and distilleries, art and photography, and much more. The Heritage Village includes the 1822 Gregory Inn plus 8 other historic buildings and Farm Museum. The Festival will feature: a civil war encampment, children's hands on activities and a touch of fall which includes a 'children's pumpkin chucking', scarecrow making. Enjoy the museum's newest General Store Exhibit and building. The event is held annually the third weekend in September at the Heritage Village and Farm Museum, Alparon Park in Troy, PA.
